Readings for 11<sup>th</sup> November 2018: *Remembrance. 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Armistice*

### First Reading: Psalm 62: 5 – 12

- <sup>5</sup>For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from Him.  
<sup>6</sup>He only is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.  
<sup>7</sup>On God rests my salvation and my glory; my mighty rock, my refuge is God.  
<sup>8</sup>Trust in Him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before Him; God is a refuge for us.  
<sup>9</sup>Those of low estate are but a breath; those of high estate are a delusion; in the balances they go up; they are together lighter than a breath.  
<sup>10</sup>Put no trust in extortion; set no vain hopes on robbery; if riches increase, set not your heart on them.  
<sup>11</sup>Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God  
<sup>12</sup>and that to You, O Lord, belongs steadfast love.  
For you will render to a man according to his work.

### Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24 – 28

- <sup>24</sup>Christ has entered, not into holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true things, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. <sup>25</sup>Nor was it to offer Himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters the holy places every year with blood not his own, <sup>26</sup>for then He would have had to suffer repeatedly since the foundation of the world.  
But as it is, He has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself.  
<sup>27</sup>And just as it is appointed for man to die once and after that comes judgement, <sup>28</sup>so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for Him.

### Gospel Reading: Mark 1: 14 – 20

- <sup>14</sup>Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God  
<sup>15</sup>and saying,  
“The time is fulfilled and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel.”  
<sup>16</sup>Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, He saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen.  
<sup>17</sup>And Jesus said to them, “Follow me and I will make you become fishers of men.”  
<sup>18</sup>And immediately they left their nets and followed Him. <sup>19</sup>And going on a little farther, He saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. <sup>20</sup>And immediately He called them and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed Him.
