Readings for 12th January 2020: The Baptism of Christ (Epiphany I)

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 42: 1 – 9

¹Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights;

I have put my Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the nations.

²He will not cry aloud or lift up His voice, or make it heard in the street; ³a bruised reed He will not break and a faintly burning wick He will not quench; He will faithfully bring forth justice. ⁴He will not grow faint or be discouraged till He has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for His law.

⁵Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it:

⁶"I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations, ⁷to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.

8I am the LORD; that is my name; my glory I give to no other,

nor my praise to carved idols.

⁹Behold, the former things have come to pass and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them."

New Testament Reading: Acts 10: 34 – 43

³⁴So Peter opened his mouth and said:

"Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears Him and does what is right is acceptable to Him. ³⁶As for the word that He sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (He is Lord of all), ³⁷you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power.

He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him. ³⁹And we are witnesses of all that He did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put Him to death by hanging Him on a tree, ⁴⁰but God raised Him on the third day and caused Him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead. ⁴²And He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that He is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³To Him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins through His name."

Gospel Reading: Matthew 3: 13 – 17

¹³Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptised by him. ¹⁴John would have prevented Him, saying, "I need to be baptised by You and do You come to me?" ¹⁵But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil all righteousness." Then he consented.

¹⁶And when Jesus was baptised, immediately He went up from the water and behold! the heavens were opened to Him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on Him; ¹⁷and behold! a voice from heaven said,

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

A big (belated) thank you to Steve and Mark for putting up and decorating the beautiful Christmas Tree in Church.

Ledbury Bells Appeal: A huge thank-you to all who have sponsored items from our "menu" in the last month. We have now found sponsors for 4 new bells, 3 refurbished bells, 22 clock hammers, 10 ropes and one new frame side to house the additional bells. In all we are close to £230,000 raised and need a further £40,000 to enable all the work to take place in the tower. The money for the bells is now in place and work can start on March 16th. We will shortly publish a new list of possible items for sponsorship to help get us to our target. We are delighted with the progress we have made and the encouragement and support we have received. We would love to find a sponsor (£5,000) for the one remaining bell that needs complete refurbishment. The chance to have your name engraved on a bell comes up, perhaps, once in every 100 years in Ledbury so it is a special opportunity for a commemoration or, perhaps, memorial. READINGS FOR MORNING WORSHIP

Psalm 139 verses 1-6

1 You have searched me, LORD, and you know me. 2 You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. 3 You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways. 4 Before a word is on my tongue you, LORD, know it completely. 5 You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me. 6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.

1 Corinthians verses 2: 6-16

6 We do, however, speak a message of wisdom among the mature, but not the wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing. 7 No, we declare God's wisdom, a mystery that has been hidden and that God destined for our glory before time began. 8 None of the rulers of this age understood it, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. 9 However, as it is written: "What no eye has seen, what no ear has heard, and what no human mind has conceived" — the things God has prepared for those who love him— 10 these are the things God has revealed to us by his Spirit. The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. 11 For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. 12 What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us. 13 This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, explaining spiritual realities with Spirit-taught words. 14 The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit. 15 The person with the Spirit makes judgments about all things, but such a person is not subject to merely human judgments, 16 for, "Who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?" But we have the mind of Christ.
