# An Old Testament Reading from: Genesis 32: 22 – 32

<sup>22</sup>The same night [Jacob] arose and took his two wives, his two female servants and his eleven children and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. <sup>23</sup> He took them and sent them across the stream and everything else that he had. <sup>24</sup> And Jacob was left alone. And a man wrestled with him until the breaking of the day. <sup>25</sup> When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he touched his hip socket and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. <sup>26</sup> Then he said, "Let me go, for the day has broken." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." <sup>27</sup> And He said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." <sup>28</sup> Then He said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men and have prevailed." <sup>29</sup> Then Jacob asked Him, "Please tell me your name." But He said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there He blessed him. <sup>30</sup> So Jacob called the name of the place Peniel, [*Peniel means the face of God*] saying, "For I have seen God face to face and yet my life has been delivered."

<sup>31</sup> The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip. <sup>32</sup> Therefore to this day the people of Israel do not eat the sinew of the thigh that is on the hip socket, because He touched the socket of Jacob's hip on the sinew of the thigh.

# A New Testament Reading from: Romans 9: 1-5

I [Paul] am speaking the truth in Christ — I am not lying; my conscience bears me witness in the Holy Spirit — <sup>2</sup>that I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. <sup>3</sup> For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brothers, my kinsmen according to the flesh. <sup>4</sup>They are Israelites and to them belong the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship and the promises. <sup>5</sup>To them belong the patriarchs and from their race, according to the flesh, is the Christ who is God over all, blessed for ever. Amen.

## A Reading from the Gospel of: Matthew 14: 13 – 21

<sup>13</sup> When Jesus heard [about John the Baptist's death], He withdrew from [where He was] in a boat to a desolate place by Himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed Him on foot from the towns. <sup>14</sup> When He went ashore He saw a great crowd and He had compassion on them and healed their sick.

<sup>15</sup> Now when it was evening, the disciples came to Him and said, "This is a desolate place and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves." <sup>16</sup> But Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." <sup>17</sup> They said to Him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish." <sup>18</sup> And He said, "Bring them here to me." <sup>19</sup> Then He ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass and taking the five loaves and the two fish, He looked up to heaven and said a blessing. Then He broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples and the disciples gave them to the crowds. <sup>20</sup> And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over. <sup>21</sup> And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.



#### Bell Project: Volunteers needed to help clean and paint the bell frame

We can save over £5,000 if we scrape down and then paint the bell frame ourselves. The work will take place in the first two weeks of August. We need a team of about 12 -15 people that we can split into groups of 4-5 who could do a 3 hour shift for either scraping / wire-brushing or painting whilst being properly socially-distanced. The cleaning will be messy work (wire brushes doing most of the work) but we will provide gloves and masks (unless you wish to provide your own). You should bring your own overalls.

We expect that each of the two operations will take up to three days. We will paint the frame with primer once it is cleaned. The final coat will need to wait until September when the extra bits of frame needed for the new bells have been added.

Would you be able to help us? Below is a picture of the bell frame to give you some idea of the challenge! We hope that all those involved will be able to feel a sense of pride that they played an active part in this major project for the church. Lots of pictures will be taken for posterity!
